



**Je m'appelle Rachel Corrie.** Crushed by an Israeli bulldozer she was trying to dissuade from destroying homes in Gaza in 2003, Rachel Corrie was a passionate young woman who had travelled from the state of Washington to Palestine to support non-violent resistance to the military occupation. She was also a brilliant writer, as anyone will attest who has seen *I am Rachel Corrie*, the powerfully moving monologue adapted in 2005 by Alan Rickman and Katharine Viner from the subject's own correspondence

with family and friends. The theatre piece presents, essentially, her own story in her own words. It is performed here in French translation (by Séverine Magois) for the first time. Jasmina Doueb directs Cécile Vangrieken, above, as Rachel.
